## **OUR OUTDOOR ENVIRONMENT**

Mile Oak is lucky to have extensive school grounds, in which we have developed a number of different areas to enrich children's learning and provide them with opportunities beyond the classroom.

With a dedicated Eco/Healthy School co-coordinator, we pride ourselves on our approach to raising children's awareness of our local and global environmental responsibilities.

In addition to our playgrounds and large, secure school field, the school has:

- A central garden area with raised growing beds and a greenhouse
- An enclosed school orchard of heritage apples and plums.
- A pond with raised dipping platform and wildlife area.
- A paved "quiet retreat" area with picnic benches, table tennis tables and a variety of "big games" to play.
- A Forest School site with fire circle and camp areas.
- An array of solar panels installed, which as well as saving over 32 tonnes of carbon emissions annually, enable us to fund a number of other eco initiatives.

Every year, we participate in many events including:

•The National 'Let's Get Cooking' scheme and run a popular weekly Cooking club for children, introducing them to healthy menus and the virtues of cooking "from scratch".

 Regular 'Walk to School' and 'Bike it' initiatives where we encourage children to walk, bike or scoot to school.

• Growing our own range of vegetables, which the children either cook and eat at school or take home to share with their families.

## **OUR HOUSE SYSTEM**

All children and staff are incredibly proud to belong to one of our four school houses which are all named after local castles:







All children and staff receive a badge which represents their house colour to develop the sense of community throughout the school.

The house system provides the opportunity for children to work together across different year groups, increases community spirit, enables peer mentoring programmes, boosts the existing rewards system, encourages more students to get involved in competitions and develops leadership opportunities for students as they progress through the school.

House Captains and Vice Captains are Year 6 pupils, voted for by the House at the start of the year. They help to organise the House and run the House meetings.

In addition to the captains and vice captains, children have leadership opportunities within their houses through applying for the roles of:

- Sports Leaders
- Healthy Schools Leaders
- Science Ambassadors
- Reading Buddies
- Maths Mentors
- Playground Buddies

Children are given the opportunity to represent their house in a wide range of activities including; house debates, inter-house sports competitions, maths challenges, after school workshops, science fairs, musical events and lots more.

The vast selection of events reflects our intention to make our house system holistic and engaging; we aim to nurture and celebrate every child.

Another important focus of the house system is raising money for charity; children take part in a charity event every year. All money raised is donated to a charity selected by the house.

We are incredibly proud of our house system and aim to make every member of our community feel a sense of belonging and pride every time they enter through our school gates.

Each week, children collect house points for demonstrating any of our four school values. These are counted up ready for our weekly Celebration Assembly. During the assembly the winning house for that week is announced. This weekly winning house is rewarded by being able to wear their own clothes on the following Monday.

Scores are collated throughout the term and the winning house for the term get a house party on the field!

Winners for the year get their house names engraved onto the highly prized House Cup along with a surprise celebration!

## **School Council**

We pride ourselves on providing meaningful opportunities to gain pupil voice on all matters of school life.

In addition to the regular collation of pupil voice surveys, our very active school council, formed with children from year 1 to year 6, meets every other week.

Every year, each class votes to choose two children from their class to represent them.

## **STARTING SCHOOL**

Do reassure your children about school; talk to them about their teacher, about the activities they will be doing, about the friends they will make and above all about the happy times they will have.

Please go onto the school website to watch a tour of the reception environment and see some of the key adults in school introducing themselves.

Make sure they know the routines for coming into school in the morning, using the toilets, changing shoes, wearing aprons for messy activities etc. Assure them that you will be able to bring them into school and settle them for the first day.

After that, we hope that quite soon you will be able to leave them - children often settle more quickly once parents have left. If your child is unduly distressed at school, we will of course make contact with you.

During their first few weeks in school we understand that children may feel comforted by bringing a soft toy to help settle them. Ideally this would be small and kept in their pocket during lesson time.



### SAFETY

Parents dropping off or collecting children in cars are asked to please not stop or park near the school gates where they might block children's view of the traffic or where they could cause congestion. We thank you for your assistance in ensuring that children are safe as they come to and leave school.

## THE SCHOOL DAY

#### **Before School**

The Infant playground is supervised from 8.45am. When children first enter the Reception Class, parents are invited to come into the playground with them in the morning and wait while they line up and meet their teacher. We expect this arrangement to last for the first half term. After that time, we encourage parents to leave their children at the Infant gate to develop independence. Senior members of staff are on duty at this gate from 8.45am.

#### **After School**

At the end of the school day, parents are asked to wait in the Infant Playground where children will be dismissed by their teacher. It is at this time that parents can speak briefly with class teachers to arrange appointments.

We ask that you please inform us of any changes to end of day arrangements for picking up your child so we can ensure their safety at all times. The School Office is open from 8.30 am – 4.30 pm each day and you can contact us via email at any time.

#### What is Free Flow?

Free flow is child-initiated learning where children can choose from the wide range of activities set up in the indoor and outdoor learning environments.

Early years practitioners work with small groups of children or individually to interact with, teach and assess children during this time.









## **BREAKFAST CLUB**

Mile Oak Primary School has a very well attended Breakfast Club which is held every school day from 7.45 a.m. until 8.55 a.m. in the Infant Hall. This is run by our own staff, who know the children.

The inclusive cost per day is £2.50 and £2.00 per additional child. Children should arrive from 7.45 a.m.

Children do not need to attend every day but do need to book in advance. Bookings and payment should be made through 'ParentPay'. Children need to be registered before they attend their first session. Registration forms are available from the School Office. Information on ingredients is available to view if your child suffers from an allergy.

Children may choose any items from our healthy menu options which include wholemeal bread, bagels and pitta bread, with various toppings, fruit juice, milk, cereals and a selection of fruit and vegetables.

Children will, in addition, have access to a variety of play equipment and activities and may also take part in organised sporting activities from 8.15 onwards if they choose to do so.

The Breakfast Club is a service set up by the school to support parents and children. Charges are used to cover salary and additional expenses.





## **AFTER SCHOOL CLUB**

SCHOOL LUNCHES

At Mile Primary School, we offer delicious hot school lunches for free to all Reception and Key Stage 1 pupils.

Each day the kitchen offers a choice of two meals, one usually meat based and a second vegetarian option. All menu options come with a range of vegetable sides and a 'help yourself' salad bar plus a low-sugar dessert. The menus run on a three weekly rota, as seen in the example menu.

At the start of Reception we encourage all children to try school dinners. Teaching staff accompany the children to dinner for the first few weeks to ensure they are settled.

Once your child reaches Key Stage 2, school lunches then come at a cost of £2.20 each unless you are eligible for free school meals.

If your child still finds it hard to choose something to eat, you have the option of sending them in with a healthy packed lunch.

#### Milk and Snacks

Every child is provided with a piece of fresh fruit at break time. Every child under the age of 5 qualifies for free school milk. Once children reach their fifth birthday, parents can choose to pay for their child to continue receiving it. See the milk section of this booklet for further information.

# COLLECTION FROM SCHOOL

We take the safety of our pupils extremely seriously so, at home time, there are a few safety procedures we would like you to follow to ensure a safe exit from school.

When collecting your child from school, walk to the infant playground gate and into the playground. You are then asked to wait behind the cones so that the pupils are not crowded and it is easy for your child's teacher to make visual contact with each parent/carer. Your children will be brought out into the playground at a safe distance from the other adults and will remain with their teacher until safely handed over to the grown up who is collecting them.

At this time, you are welcome to have a brief discussion with your child's class teacher and teachers may want to discuss your child's day with you. If you need to have a longer discussion with teaching staff, please make an appointment at the front office for a mutually convenient time.

## **SAFEGUARDING**

'Children learn best when they are healthy, safe and secure, when their individual needs are met, and when they have positive relationships with the adults caring for them..' (EYFS framework 2012)

At Mile Oak Primary School, our first concern is your child's welfare. The school has a commitment to the welfare and protection of all children in our care. All staff and volunteers receive annual safeguarding training.

At times, our designated safeguarding team work with other agencies to help us support our children and families.

Please see our Safeguarding Policy for full information as to how we meet the legal welfare requirements as stated within the Statutory Framework for Early Years Foundation Stage 2017 which can be found on our school website.

We strive to protect children's physical and emotional wellbeing and an important aspect of this is helping children to learn about keeping safe. We provide children with choices to help them develop this important life skill. We encourage children to take risks and highlight the importance of keeping themselves safe by teaching them how to recognise and avoid hazards and also who to seek help from, should they need it.

We have a wealth of nurturing provision available to support children at times of need, including:

## INCLUSIVITY

At Mile Oak, we passionately believe in creating an inclusive school experience for all children.

We are committed to meeting the needs of all pupils, ensuring that they make progress from their own individual starting points. We value all children and are committed to our whole school vision of "Think Big".

The mission statement of our school affirms our commitment to valuing the individuality of children. We provide all children with every opportunity to achieve the highest of standards. We do this by respecting and taking account of pupils' varied life experiences and needs.

Our school promotes the individuality of all our children, irrespective of ethnicity, attainment, age, disability, gender or background and that pupils have a common curriculum experience.



## ATTENDANCE

By law, all children of compulsory school age must receive a suitable full-time education. Parents and carers have a legal responsibility to ensure their child attends school regularly and on time. We ask that you support us in our aims for attendance and punctuality to exceed the national target of 96%.

If your child is absent from school, we ask that you telephone the school 24 hours Absence Line (01273 294883) before 9.15 am each day of their absence. Schools are encouraged to monitor attendance and punctuality very carefully and the school liaises closely with Brighton and Hove Local Authority.

Children who are physically sick overnight should be kept at home the next day to recover. Cases of contagious illness should be reported to the school as soon as a diagnosis is made.

Should your child become ill or have an accident at school, we will always telephone you so you may collect them. It is important to keep us informed of any change in your contact details as soon as they occur.

Routine medical and dental appointments should be made during the school holidays or after school. However, we are aware that some appointments are unavoidable, so if your child has an appointment during the school day we ask that you give us as much notice as possible and provide proof of the appointment. Where possible your child should attend school before the appointment and return immediately after. Please report to the School Office before the appointment to sign your child out of school and staff will arrange for your child to be collected from their class.

The school is unable to authorise absences for holidays, birthday outings etc. unless there are exceptional circumstances. Brighton & Hove LA policy is that any absence has a detrimental effect on a child's education and penalty notices will be issued for any unauthorised holiday taken during term time. ## **COOL MILK**

Our school provides a milk scheme that is available to all of our pupils and we would like to invite you to register your child. School milk is free for under-5s,\* and for over-5s it is available at a termly subsidised price of £15.

Each child that registers with Cool Milk will receive a 189ml portion of semi-skimmed milk every day, delivered fresh and chilled to the classroom. Their school milk will not only provide them with essential nutrients, but as it is rehydrating and energy boosting it also bridges the gap between breakfast and lunch to help children stay focused. Free milk will continue until the Friday before your child's fifth birthday. You will receive a payment request four weeks before their birthday - if you wish your child to continue to receive school milk, simply make a payment.

## ASSESSMENT

At Mile Oak Primary School, we use assessment to maximise your child's learning experience so that they become confident learners who THINK BIG.

In reception, we assess our pupils using the `Development Matters' guidance which usually starts in nursery. The areas that are taught and assessed through whole class, small group and 1 to 1 teaching and observations are:

•Communication and language

Physical development

•Personal, social and emotional development

•Literacy

Mathematics

Understanding the world

•Expressive art and design



The indoor and outdoor reception environment and activities are specifically designed to ensure your child achieves their potential within these areas. By the end of their time in reception, they will be assessed against the Early Learning Goals.

From Year 1, your child will be following the National Curriculum. Pupils are continually assessed by their teachers to ensure lessons are planned to meet the needs of all children.

At the end of Year 2, the pupils will go through their first Statutory Assessment Tests (SATs) where they will receive a grade measured against age related expectations.

From Year 3, your child will then be working towards their Key Stage 2 SATs that take place in Year 6. They will still be continually assessed through observation, feedback in lessons and termly summative assessments.

Throughout the year, you will have opportunities to discuss your child's progress and achievements at parent/teacher consultation evenings and through regular communication with the class teacher.

In July, you will receive a personalised written report from your child's teacher informing you of their end of year assessments and their yearly achievements across all areas of school life.



## WHAT ARE GOVERNORS?

The school has a Governing Body consisting of the headteacher and representatives from the Local Authority, the local community, staff and parents. The Governors work in partnership with the Senior Leadership Team to ensure the school operates effectively and delivers a quality education in line with the school vision, values and pledge.

## **MILE OAK GOVERNORS**

Governors are responsible for seeing that the school is properly managed and is providing appropriately for the needs of the children. In order to fulfil this function, we need to be fully informed of the organisation and curriculum of the school and the extent and use of the resources made available by the Local Authority. Governors make regular visits to the school and attend Local Authority training sessions in order to equip them to fulfil their duties more efficiently.

The Governors meet, as a full board, once a half term to discuss matters relating to the school. Sub-committees covering teaching and learning, personnel, premises, health & safety and financial matters also meet once a half term. At Mile Oak we wish to foster a happy and supportive relationship, working in partnership with staff and parents to provide the most effective education for the children. Governors are kept fully informed of all matters relating to the running of the school and are frequent visitors.

Further details about the Governing body are on the school website. Parents who wish to seek advice on matters concerning the school or who wish to have matters raised at meetings can contact the Clerk to Governors via the school office. Governors at the school are appointed to serve for a period of four years, and we welcome parents who wish to become governors. We also work closely with the school's parent's organisation, Friends of Mile Oak.

We hope your child will be very happy at our school, and we look forward to meeting you at some of the many school events during the year.
